

Drama in Human Rights Education – a training Seminar
German-Czech seminar for people actively working with youths and adults

1 – 4 November 2007 (arrival date: 31 October) in Decin (Czech Republic)

Funded by the “Remembrance and Future” Fund of the Foundation “Remembrance, Responsibility and Future”

In cooperation with the Czech National Agency YOUTH, the German Institute for Human Rights organizes a training seminar on Human Rights Education. The seminar will focus on discrimination as a core concept of Human Rights and uses methods of drama as a means for Human Rights Education.

The course will take place in Decin (North of Czech Republic), in a small educational centre associated with an NGO working with handicapped people. The time of travel from Dresden amounts to one hour by train. It is addressed to people who are working in the field of education with youths and adults.

The objective of the seminar is to raise awareness of Human Rights and Discrimination and to learn how to become active within the diverse fields of the participants' work. Drama techniques will be used that allow participants to become practically involved in an interactive and participatory seminar. There is no need of experiences in Drama or in Human Rights. The participants will become familiar with basic information about Human Rights as well as with various forms of discrimination (e.g. racism, sexism, homophobia). Relevant Covenants on international and national level as e.g. ICERD, CEDAW, ECHR will be introduced.

The working language is English.

The Team of Trainers comes from Czech Republic and Germany:

Jana Tikalova is involved in youth work since 1997, after setting up her NGO OPIM in 2001, she is actively working in the field of Human Rights and Human Rights Education on international and national level.

Till Baumann is a free-lance theatre practitioner based in Berlin with a focus on peace and Human Rights issues.

Anne Thiemann has a Master of “Social Work as a Human Rights Profession” and is working as an educator in the field of Human Rights Education at the German Institute for Human Rights
